

Course Description:

This advisement course will be required of Coordinated Program (CP) students who do not complete any supervised practice rotation in the allotted one year time frame. Advisement will focus on guiding and mentoring the student through their completion of the rotation.

Credits: One (1)

Course Format and Modes of Instruction:

At the end of the rotation, the students are to compile in portfolio format all evaluation forms, experience log, tests, and assignments completed during rotation. Student must also include lesson plans, handouts, reports etc. required for the rotation. Students will also show how they achieved created objectives determined at the beginning of the semester.

Prerequisites:

The CP student must be enrolled in any of the supervised practice rotation courses NUTR4619, NUT4629, NUT4639, NUTR4649, NUTR4659, NUTR4669, NUTR4679, NUTR4689, NUTR 4699.

Course Goals and Objectives:

The goal of this course is to provide students with a forum for continued advisement during the completion of their supervised practice rotations. The expectations are completion of the supervised practice with the submittal of a portfolio.

The objectives of the course will be met through individual consultations with course faculty, email correspondence and group consultations as needed or scheduled. The student will be able to complete the objectives listed in the supervised practice course syllabus and will be met while completing the supervised practice at the rotation sites, web-based tutorials, assigned readings, case studies, journal reviews and discussion.

Course Requirements:

- By Week 2, students are required to submit 2-3 objectives related to the rotation that is being completed including how the rotation will be completed including a timeline for completing the requirements of the supervised practice course within the semester enrolled in NUTR 4700.
- Summary of how objectives were completed will be submitted along with the required portfolio by posted date in course.
- Students are required to report in weekly on the Discussion Forum in Moodle their progress in a particular rotation.
- Any remediation projects required will be assigned by the Instructor and due dates determined on an individual basis.

Portfolio Contents

Contents of the portfolio are listed within each individual rotation course syllabus. All assignments must be typed. The final portfolio will be evaluated for completeness, accuracy, neatness and attention to detail.

Grade Determination

There will be no grade for this course other than a PASS or FAIL.
