POLICY: Dissertation Course Sequence and Requirements

PURPOSE: This policy prescribes the sequence and requirements of courses necessary to complete the dissertation requirement for the Ph.D. in Psychiatric Rehabilitation

RESPONSIBILITY: Students admitted to the dissertation track of the Ph.D. program

Course Number	Activities/Requirements	Prerequisites
PSRT7001-Seminar I* (3 credits)	Student is oriented to the dissertation process and presents a dissertation research plan before a colloquium of faculty and students.	
PSRT7002-Advisement* (1 credit)	Continuing registration/advisement. Students with an incomplete or in-progress grade in any 7000 level course must register for Advisement each semester or re-register for the incomplete course.	Incompletes in PSRT 7001, - 03, -05, or -07
PSRT7003-Seminar II* (3 credits)	Proposal (Introduction, Literature Review and Methods Chapters) is written signed/accepted by all members of the dissertation committee after a presentation by the candidate to the entire committee.	PSRT7001
PSRT7005 Dissertation Research* (3 credits)	Data collection is begun and completed during this course. Completion requires approval of the Dissertation Committee.	PSRT7003
PSRT7007-Dissertation Writing* (3 credits)	Write final version of the dissertation. Passed oral defense and submitted completed/signed dissertation to the committee chair, committee members, Department, school, and Dissertation Abstracts International.	PSRT7005
