PHLEBOTOMY & SPECIMEN ACCESSIONING PROGRAM

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

- Part I consists of lectures on campus on blood specimen collection by venipuncture and skin puncture. Additional topics include anatomy and physiology of body systems with emphasis on the circulatory system; infection control, safety, and quality assurance; specimen processing and storage including other types of lab specimens; and legal responsibilities of the phlebotomist. Students must achieve a minimum overall course average of 70% and a minimum grade of 70% on the final comprehensive exam to successfully complete Part I and be able to continue to Part II.
- Part II consists of practice in venipuncture and skin puncture with 12 hours of student laboratory on campus and a mandatory, 100-hour clinical rotation at an affiliated hospital clinical site. Failure to complete the clinical rotation will result in an incomplete and failure of the course.
 - Students must complete 100 hours AND a minimum of 100 successful venipunctures and skin punctures at an affiliated hospital clinical site.
 - The clinical sites are located in Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Passaic, and Bergen counties.
 - Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the clinical sites
 - The clinical rotation must be completed within 6 months from start of the program
 - Clinical rotations are scheduled in 4 cycles. Students are scheduled for one of the cycles depending on clinical site availability. Tentative rotation cycles are:

Cycle I: 4/2-4/20 Cycle II: 4/23-5/11 Cycle III: 5/14-6/1 Cycle IV: 6/4-6/22

Upon successful completion of Part I and Part II students will be awarded a School certificate, and will be eligible to take the American Society of Clinical Pathology certification exam in the Phlebotomist category, PBT(ASCP).

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Requirement	Patient Contact With Risk of Exposure To Blood or Potentially In- fectious Body Fluids
Hepatitis B*- 3 doses of vaccine (at least one dose prior to any activities with any risk of exposure) or serologic proof of immunity. Hepatitis B quantitative surface antibodies (1 month after last dose)	REQUIRED Post-vaccination serology REQUIRED Hepatitis B Record
TB testing* – PPD Mantoux 2 STEP or an FDA approved blood assay for TB	REQUIRED
Measles–2 doses of vaccine or serologic proof of immunity	REQUIRED
Mumps– 2 doses of vaccine or serologic proof of immunity	REQUIRED
Rubella–1 dose of vaccine or serologic proof of immunity	REQUIRED
Influenza- annual dose of vaccine in the fall	REQUIRED
Varicella–2 doses of vaccine or serologic proof of immunity	REQUIRED
Adult Tdap	REQUIRED
Polio – Primary 3-dose series of vaccine or booster dose(s)	RECOMMENDED

- The student is responsible for any costs associated with providing the required documents listed above.
- All documentation must be complete. Partial information/ submissions will not be accepted, and will be returned to the student.
- Students will not be permitted to begin the program unless all medical/immunization information has been deemed compliant by Rutgers Student Health Services.
- ◆ All information/immunizations must be complete and sent to Student Health Services by November 1, 2017.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK:

In order to complete your educational program at Rutgers, a criminal background check is required. Rutgers engages the services of a consumer reporting agency to conduct this background check. Authorization to conduct this background check and results deemed favorable by **Rutgers and clinical facilities** are conditions for admission and continued enrollment. **Only the Rutgers approved agency can perform this background check.**

CANCELLATION OF COURSE:

The courses require minimum enrollment and may be cancelled because of insufficient enrollment. If a course is cancelled, the student will be notified and given a full tuition refund.

COURSE TUITION AND FEES REFUND POLICY:

All fees are non-refundable. A tuition refund, less a \$100 administration fee will be issued if notice is received in writing, one month before the first day of class. No refund of tuition will be given if cancellation is requested after that time.

CONFIRMATION:

A confirmation letter will be sent to the student prior to the start of class.

Program graduates from 2015 through 2017 have a 100% pass rate on the National Certification Examination administered by the American Society for Clinical Pathology - Board of Certification.
